

Reason why	project was exempt:	The Project is exempt pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines § 15304 (Class 4 – Minor Alteration to Land), which consists of minor public alterations in the condition of land which does not involve the removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees except for forestry or agricultural purposes. The Project involves the use of goats to graze down invasive grasses in an area with steep terrain in order to reduce fuels in a fire prone community, as well as minimal hand work. The Project involves reducing the height of grasses on site and does not involve the removal of trees, consistent with the Class 4 exemption. Additionally, the Project is exempt pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines § 15308 (Class 8 – Action by Agencies for the Protection of the Environment), as the Project is designed to maintain and protect the environment through the reduction of invasive grasses which could serve as fuel in a wildfire-prone community. Finally, the Project is exempt pursuant to the common sense exemption, State CEQA Guidelines § 15061(b)(3), as there is no possibility for a significant effect on the environment. The project involves goats grazing on invasive grasses and minimal hand work for the protection of the environment.  None of the exceptions to the categorical exemptions set forth in State CEQA Guidelines § 15300.2 apply to the Project. The Project site is hilly terrain in an area which is disturbed and surrounded by development. There would be no cumulative impacts, as this method of fuels reduction would not result in environmental impacts as it would not permanently impact the site, even if used on the same site in the future. The Project would not damage scenic resources within a state scenic highway, it is not a hazardous waste site, and there are no unusual circumstances related to the Project. As the Project involves the reduction of grasses through the use of grazing goats and minimal hand work; it would not impact historical resources as no ground disturbance is proposed.
