5.	Description of nature, purpose, and beneficiaries of Project:	This Project will consist of uplifting and enhancing a 1.5-acre section of the El Dorado Ranch Park in Yucaipa, CA. For the 1.5-acre restoration, the Inland Empire Resource Conservation District (“IERCD”) will conduct site preparation by treating and removing the herbaceous weeds that currently vegetate the property. This will be followed by the introduction of Milkweed and other native plants for Monarch and pollinator habitat. On April 13 th , 2023, the IERCD Board of Directors approved the Project.

Description of nature, purpose, and beneficiaries of Project:	This Project will consist of uplifting and enhancing a 2-acre section of the Louis Rubidoux Parkland and Pecan Grove that is owned by the County of Riverside but managed by the Inland Empire Resource Conservation District. The property is a 40-acre semi-natural park and open space that is currently composed mostly of non-native grasslands, but it is a suitable site for Monarch pollinator habitat. The proposed restoration on the 2-acre section will entail creating an interpretive pollinator garden at the park that models nearby natural areas. On April 13 th , 2023, the IERCD Board of Directors approved the Project.
